Struggling to support your students' wide range of abilities?

This fast paced, highly interactive course will provide educators with tools and strategies to effectively implement assistive and instructional technologies with students who struggle with typical curricular tasks. Through practical activities and hands on exploration, you will learn how to identify which technologies are appropriate for specific student needs, how to adjust lesson plans to include a variety of technology tools, and how to create materials to support and assess students' learning with these tools.

If you are working with elementary or secondary students who struggle with literacy or numeracy, have specific diagnoses like developmental delays, autism, dyslexia, and FAS or have physical disabilities which restrict their access to the curriculum, this course will help you discover many technology based solutions which will create the supportive environment these students need to meet their individual potentials.

This blended course will combine face-to-face classroom meetings and online collaboration for a flexible learning environment. Course participants will gain valuable practice not only implementing a variety of assistive technologies but will also become proficient utilizing online learning resources and working in virtual teams.

The course will be facilitated by Kerry Randle (krandle@setbc.org), a Special Education Technology British Columbia (SET-BC) Provincial Resource Teacher. She has years of experience in the field and a great deal of enthusiasm for assistive and online technologies. Due to the high level of interactivity and the availability of technology loans, participation in the course is very limited so early registration is strongly recommended.
