

Like all SET-BC technology, iPads and iPods are loaned to the school district or independent school for use with a designated student to support access to his or her educational program. The loan of iPads and iPods for student use follows all current SET-BC technology loan policies.

- iPads and iPods are loaned to schools or school districts as 2-point solutions as outlined in the SET-BC service delivery policy.
  - SET-BC will provide, from the date of the initial loan, five years of technical support and repair for iPads and iPods.
- iPads and iPods will be loaned to the school district or independent school with the standard set of applications that come with the device in its default, 'out of the box' configuration.
  - They will be shipped with a wall charger and a carrying case, the specific type to be identified at CAP meeting.
  - Optional accessories include a stand, keyboard, Bluetooth speaker, headphones or stylus – those necessary will also be identified at the CAP meeting.
- SET-BC can provide reimbursement for a small, defined set of applications considered to be assistive technology solutions only (e.g. ProLoquo2Go, TouchChat Suite). These applications must be identified at the Collaborative Action Plan meeting in consultation with the SET-BC consultant. He or she will have a current list of SET-BC supported applications with the list also being available on our website ([www.setbc.org/support/ipad\\_policy.html](http://www.setbc.org/support/ipad_policy.html)).
  - As the installation of any applications on iPads and iPods requires access to an iTunes account, the school or school district will need to establish the primary iTunes account. The location and long term administration of the primary iTunes account must also be identified at the CAP meeting.
  - If the student requires a SET-BC supported assistive technology application to meet his or her IEP goals, the school or school district will arrange to purchase and install the supported application and then invoice SET-BC to be reimbursed for that application. Information on how to invoice SET-BC for approved iApp reimbursement will be provided at the CAP meeting.
- Following our partnership on technology guidelines, all academic and productivity related applications are to be funded and supported through the school based team subject to the school district's acceptable use policies. Additionally, the school or school district is responsible for any device printing or networking requirements.
