

# Quizlet

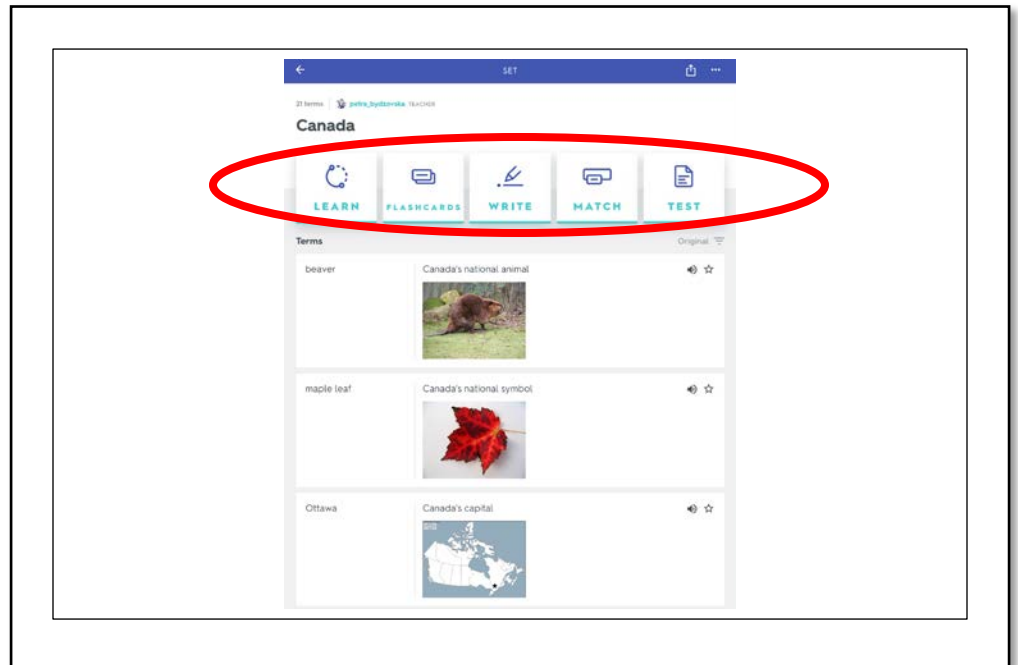
## Introduction



Quizlet is a mobile (iOS and Android) and web-based study tool ([www.quizlet.com](http://www.quizlet.com)). It consists of digital learning tools, such as flashcards, study sets, and games. Both teachers and students are able to create their own sets or find study material by searching existing sets. Teachers can also play Quizlet Live with their classes as a fun and engaging activity.

## Task Challenge/Activity

- sign up for an account with Quizlet by using an email address (or you can skip the registration and try the demo version)
- create a set (add terms/definitions, images) and have students use it
  - you can create a class if you like
  - you can also import data from Word, Excel, and Google Docs
- students do not have to sign up in order to access Quizlet but you can ask students to sign up and join your class (using code, share link, or share on Google Classroom)
- students can use your set to study (learn, flashcards, write, spell, test, match, gravity), or they can also create their own set
- play a game of Quizlet Live with your class using the set you created
- note: there are additional features on the web-based version of this tool as opposed to the mobile version (ie. spell, gravity, live)
